


This photomosaic was made by using reduced copies of 1:2,000,000-scale controlled photomosaics. The image resolution of the Viking Orbiter pictures used to compile the original mosaics is 130 to 300 m per picture element and the average sun elevation is 20° (solar zenith angle 70°). The images were digitally enhanced by the Jet Propulsion Laboratory's Mission and Test Imaging System to accentuate high-frequency detail. Image placement was based on the 1978 control net (Davies, M.E., and others, 1978, Control net of Mars: February 1978: The Rand Corp. R-2309-NASA). Appropriate "T"-series numbers may be used to obtain published copies of the 1:2,000,000-scale photomosaics.
